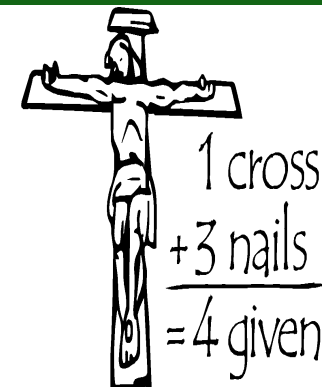
What Makes a DAD

JUMBLE SALE. The Ladies Guild are holding a grand sale in the Parish Hall this coming Saturday 25th June at 2pm. All donations welcome.

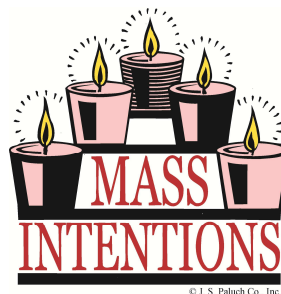
PETER'S PENCE SPECIAL COLLECTION. This annual collection will take place on Sunday 26th June. Gift Aid envelopes are not available for this collection.
