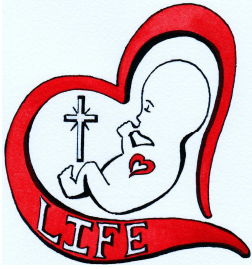

DAY FOR LIFE THEME AND SPECIAL COLLECTION. The annual special collection for the work of Pro-Life will be taken up today (Sunday 29th May). You will be handed a reflection leaflet to help keep the intention in your thoughts and prayers a wee bit beyond mentioning it here at Church today. It is THE basic human right-the Right to Life, there are

approximately 950 children aborted every month in Scotland (according to available figures from 2014). Please ensure that our consciences are properly informed of the reason for the Church's teaching on this moral matter. Pray for those who feel Abortion is the only choice available to them, pray for those 25,000 parents who sought to adopt a child in the last year, pray for those who claim it is a woman's choice only, pray for those who offer assistance to newly pregnant women to help them bring their child to birth.
